Title: Fan Creativity Unveiled: Theoretical Approaches to Fan Labor

My study explores fan labor through lenses previously used in the analysis of creativity: Freudo-Marxism, Feminism, Cognitive Science, Philosophy. It suggests the following fan labor functions: sublimation of internal conflicts, discharge of excess cognitive energies, political emancipation, play.

It aims to contribute to a more inclusive educational future where technology enhances learning without perpetuating societal inequities, guiding the creation of responsible, proficient AI systems in educational settings.

Title: Exploring the Implementation of Artificial Intelligence (AI) Writing Tools in Teaching and Learning: Faculty and Students' Perspectives in Higher Education.

Artificial Intelligence (AI) has emerged as a transformative tool in the field of education, with its potential to revolutionize teaching and learning in higher education institutions. In this paper, I explored the implementation of different AI writing tools in teaching and learning in Higher Education, focusing on the perspectives of faculty and students. By examining their perspectives and identifying the challenges that can be encountered, the study seeks to gain a better understanding of the benefits and limitations of integrating AI writing tools in higher education. There are limited studies that seek to determine the perspectives of faculty and students in higher education regarding AI writing tools.

Title: Notating November Steps: Toru Takemitsu's Graphic Scores for Shakuhachi This presentation highlights Toru Takemitsu's (1931–1996) fusion of western avant-garde, modern music, and Noh theater in compositions, with a focus on November Steps (1967). Analyzing Takemitsu's notation for shakuhachi, I draw insights from former instructor Akikazu Nakamura, exploring perspectives and performer reactions. This study addresses gaps in existing literature, probing if Takemitsu's approach truly achieves an ideal fusion of musical traditions. Additionally, it introduces new musicians and broadens ethnomusicological interest in modern Japanese composers.

Title: Why Do Undergraduates Dislike Mathematics?

This study investigates undergraduates' math dislike, exploring origins and contributing factors. Through qualitative semi-structured interviews with 15 undergraduates, preliminary findings reveal dislike originating as early as grade 1 and caused by disconnect, neglect, and test focus.

Title: Revolutionizing Education: Harnessing the Power of ChatGPT to Develop Innovative Class Materials

The landscape of education has undergone fundamental transformations in response to technological advancements, particularly within the realm of artificial Intelligence (AI) (Zhu et al., 2023). Recent years have seen the emergence of promising AI systems, such as ChatGPT, that portend significant and beneficial advances in the field of education. This research emphasizes the advantages of incorporating ChatGPT as an assistive tool in class preparation and lesson planning for educators. This study takes place in the framework of a comprehensive workshop given to the pre-service teachers to educate and train them working with the ChatGPT to produce the best lesson plans and class materials.
