6 Qualities Every Start-Up Employee Needs

1) Don't pay attention to the checkbook

More money doesn't necessarily equal better business, at least in the beginning. A good employee doesn't care about office décor, or having a constant plethora of office supplies. Instead of relying on the resources of others, good start-up employees fend for themselves.

2) Prefer acting to thinking

Great start-up employees spend a little time planning and a lot more time doing. They don't let insecurities and apprehensions block the path to success. If, occasionally, they make a mistake, they simply learn from the error and begin again.

3) Only care about what the customer sees

Start-up employees should understand that customer is always key. Therefore, money will only be spent if it benefits public image and customer satisfaction. 4) Hunt what they can kill

5) Understand that a living is earned, not given

They don't call it, "work" for nothing. Success will never simply happen to a business; it must be earned. Likewise, start-up employees' paychecks are based on performance and a desire to earn their pay.

6) Don't drift into tasks that don't generate revenue

Every start-up employee should put pride aside at the beginning of a business venture, and only focus on tasks that bring in money. It doesn't matter if you like social media - if it's not helping the company holistically, forget it! Great employees understand that time is money, so if a task doesn't pay, they put it away.
